




Less well-known is the Statute of the International Court of Justice, which forms an integral part of the Charter (Chapter XIV, Articles 92-96). Article 38(1) of the Statute specifies the sources of international law on which the judges of the ICJ rely when deciding disputes between UN member states. It has been argued by many a cooperative lawyer that cooperation as a practice and, in particular, the values and principles, fall within the interpretation of, inter alia, Art. 38 (1) (b) as evidence of general practice as law.



This can be supported by the 2016 inscription of the *idea and practice of organizing shared interest in cooperatives* on UNESCO's Representative List of Intangible Cultural Heritage. In his 2021 paper for the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs entitled "Cooperative Law - the Translation of the Cooperative Principles into legal rules which respect the legal concept of sustainable development", Prof. Hagen Henry, Chair of the ICA Cooperative Law Committee, explained the nature and role of cooperative law, including public international cooperative law, and the legal obligations of cooperative institutions, including the ICA, in upholding the Statement on the Cooperative Identity.

We are pleased to bring you the season's greetings and the latest issue of the Cooperative Law Bulletin on this day which coincides with the anniversaries of the entry into force of the international rule book for nations, as well as the international day dedicated to drawing the attention of the world to the development problems and fostering cooperation to solve them.

Across Europe and North America, cooperatives play a significant role in the finance sector, with thousands of financial cooperatives and even more members. In contrast, the Arab region has a robust cooperative movement, but this activity has not extended to the financial services sector. This lack deprives Arab nations of numerous opportunities financial cooperatives could have provided. *Read more*

## **EU Competition Law and Sustainability by Fair Trade**

The Fair Trade movement successfully merged sustainability with Competition Law, eliminating ambiguity that hindered progress. With the updated guidelines, businesses can pursue sustainability goals more effectively, fostering a future where economic success aligns with social and environmental responsibility. This approach favors cooperation over unilateral action, as sustainability initiatives often increase costs and risk customer loss in price-sensitive markets with little product differentiation. *Read more*

The EC's Social Economy Action Plan recommendation was adopted during the EPSCO European Council. This encourages states to intervene to support social economy bodies, recognise their values, and reduce variation between EU member states regarding the treatment of these bodies. *Read more*

Giant farm **cooperatives will be subject to the global minimum corporate tax**, generating over 1.5 billion euros for the state, or a minimum 15% tax rate. Since these larger cooperatives have substantial revenues, they must pay this tax rate. *Read more*

The French Cooperative **Enercoop wants to "fundamentally change [the] relationship with energy"** by funding a small French town's energy shift from profit-seeking conglomerates to democratized electricity production. #### A CONVERSATION

## WITH THE LEGENDARY PROF. HANS MÜNKNER

In Marburg, Germany, this July, a group of co-op law experts spoke to Professor Hans Munkner about the role of the ICA in advancing knowledge and practice.

Besides Professor Munkner, the group included the Chair of the ICA Cooperative Law Committee, Hagen Henry, law committee member Ifigeneia Douvitsa, ICA Cooperative Law Network member Dr. Leonardo Rafael D'souza, and Director of Legislation at the ICA, Santosh Kumar.

The discussion began with questions directed to Professor Munkner, the first on improving the cooperative movement. Munkner stated that cooperatives create a "democratic nucleus" that can spread depending on the cooperative's success. A cooperative that works well is the best argument for democratic economic performance - a case of actions speaking louder than words.



The relevance of the International Statement on Cooperative Identity was the subsequent discussion on the agenda and whether sectors should develop their own identity statement. In Munkner's opinion, if the statement of cooperative identity is good, then a second is redundant. Instead, individual sector statements of cooperative activity can be based on the original rather than creating separate ones that may weaken the movement.

Next, Munkner was asked what the ICA, as the representative of the cooperative movement, could do to develop cooperative law. Munkner believed that the ICA shouldn't intervene with the state's law-making. Instead, if the ICA wants to influence cooperative law at a national level, the best thing to do is to have a clear international statement as a guideline. The ICA identity statement proposes legal suggestions based on experience and isn't intended as an imposition on the state.

The conversation shifted toward education and what should occur for cooperative law to be part of the university law curriculum. An average legal education does not include cooperatives, and many must be aware of its existence. It is hard to convince lawyers to teach subjects students might not take.

Professor Hagen Henrÿ specifies that as far as cooperative law is concerned, the predecessor Recommendation 127 is much more precise. To this point, Munkner adds that the more specialized the laws are, the less they can apply as a whole. When identifying which ideas are sector-specific, those should be left out as they don't have the proper place in a general law. Further, Henrÿ argues that the law is not to go into the details but to set general rules and for nations to maintain a principle of autonomy. Detailed laws are problematic in that they present more like a policy, which can be subject to quick changes.

Cooperative lawyers must introduce cooperatives as an exciting subject matter for studies. Introducing cooperatives has proven successful with the association of cooperative researchers and institutes in Germany, where cooperative subject matter has become mainstream in general company and association law and economic policy. Henrÿ, as a final message, advocates for lawyers to have an open mind and to recognize cooperative law as an equal to build a solid groundwork for cooperatives.

17. Oct

**COODING - the first international event for cooperatives on digital and new technologies!** "COODING, an acronym for COOperatives Digital Improvement & Networking Growth, took place last on 29 and 30 September 2023 in Bologna, Italy. The event was co-organised by Fondazione Centro Studi Doc, CECOP, Fondazione PICO, and AlmaVicoo, and supported by CICOPA, Cooperatives Europe and ICA. The goal of the organisers was to enhance the inter-cooperation around the use of digital and new technologies in cooperatives". *Read more*

ICA asserts its involvement in the Policy Forum on Development of the EU. #### CASE LAW

In the 2003 legal case in Brazil, the main argument revolved around the plaintiff's status under cooperative law, described in treatment the plaintiff's by the cooperative Infocoop Serviços. The plaintiff was a supposed cooperative member but felt he was not being treated as such; instead, he was essentially classified as an employee and did not benefits receive the promised cooperative member.

The 2002 ILO Recommendation No. 193 was cited, describing the responsibility of cooperatives to follow certain principles and member regarding treatment "cooperative fraud." Specifically, state policy should "ensure that cooperatives are not created for, or directed towards, noncompliance with labor laws or used to employment establish disguised and to combat pseudorelationships cooperatives that violate workers' rights by ensuring that labor law is applied in all companies."

The plaintiff contended that he was treated like an employee under this cooperative and that the above legal framework needed to be followed. The plaintiff argued that he believed he was legally treated as an employee instead of a cooperative member and

that the actions taken by Infocoop Serviços, such as the regular payment he received, the absence of profit-sharing, and ultimately, his termination process, did not fall into the criteria of the legal framework under ILO Recommendation No. 193.

Conversely, Infocoop Serviços, or the defendant in this case, filed an ordinary appeal, arguing that the plaintiff lawfully joined their cooperative and was treated legitimately under cooperative law. Significantly, the defendant contends that the plaintiff should ultimately be treated as a member rather than an employee. Infocoop wanted to avoid the liabilities of dismissing the ILO's Recommendation and Article 442 of the Labor Code.

The court makes the final decision in favor of the plaintiff, recognizing that he had an employment relationship instead of a cooperative member relationship with Infocoop and that the stated cooperative should be held responsible for fines and free legal assistance for the plaintiff. The importance of Recommendation No. 193 in determining the outcome of this case cannot be overstated.

## LOOKING BACK...

## Guyana - "The Spirit of Cooperativism"

ICA Legal Intern Elsa Mitchell writes on the 2019 presentation by Rudolph M. Ten-Pow of the permanent mission of the Cooperative Movement in Guyana to the UN at the Commission for Social Development

Guyana is renowned for being the only country where the development model of cooperativism is in the name: the "Co-operative Republic of Guyana," originating from the formerly enslaved people who bought and managed plantations, the first cooperatives in Guyana. While most of these plantations failed due to a lack of financing and technology, the spirit of cooperativism lingered until today.

The spirit of community and the pooling of labor, capital, skills, and joint ownership of enterprise led Guyana in 1970 to create the first Cooperative Republic, only four years after independence from its colonial power. The values of cooperatives were emphasized in their potential to empower the marginalized and promote social inclusion in Guyana at a time when equality was hard-pressed.

Following 1970, a few hundred cooperative societies were established in Guyana in many sectors, including farming, consumer marketing, agro-processing, and national institutions to support the cooperatives. Such institutions included a Cooperative Bank, a Cooperative College, and legislation such as the Small Businesses Act.

In the 1980s, however, the cooperative sector began declining due to Guyana's general sustained economic decline. Especially the worldwide reduction in price, the oil shocks, and the brain drain of skilled Guyanese all contributed to the fall. As a result, Guyana went from 1,440 cooperative societies in 1989 to 1,268 in 2016. The Cooperative Bank, no longer necessary, was sold to a commercial bank.

In brighter news, the Cooperative College persevered through the economic hardships and has assisted in the attempts to revive Guyana's cooperative movement. In schools, thrift societies were introduced to try and help reignite the spirit of cooperativism in the youth. Similarly, four model cooperatives were launched in 2008 thanks to the Rural Agricultural Infrastructure Development program.

The revival of the cooperative sector in Guyana can partially be attributed to the industry aligning with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals with the overlapping principles of social inclusion, gender equality, and the economic empowerment of marginalized or excluded social groups. The UN also assists in implementing the SDGs into Guyana's National Development Plan.

In general, the global environment means the time is ripe for a resurgence of cooperatives, such as what is happening in Guyana. Organizations such as the ICA promote sharing experiences, practices, and resources. Well-known cooperatives, such as Credit Agricole in France or State Farm in the United States, are considered a success story and admired by smaller cooperatives.

Overall, the cooperative sector is recognized as having a giant potential for growth, and these cooperatives can significantly contribute to the SDGs laid out by the United Nations. The Cooperative Republic of Guyana, or Guyana, as it is more colloquially known, can develop closer ties with the global cooperative movement to share experiences and build upon the successes of the early 1970s. Guyana can also continue the process of revitalizing the cooperative sector of the national economy as a way to achieve the nation's broader national development goals.
